

## **PCC Composition Course Offerings**

The Department of English and Humanities at Pitt Community College offers four composition courses to satisfy graduation and university transfer requirements.

### **ENG 111 Expository Writing**

ENG 111 is required of all students seeking a degree or diploma in the sixty-seven curriculum programs offered.

### **ENG 112 Argument Based Research**

### **ENG 113 Literature Based Research**

### **ENG 114 Professional Research and Reporting**

In addition to ENG 111, students seeking an associate degree must complete one of the three second-level composition courses listed above - ENG 112, ENG 113, or ENG 114.

Most students are required to take two semesters of English composition at Pitt Community College to complete degrees in Associate in Applied Science, Associate in Arts, Associate in General Education, or Associate in Science. All degrees and most diplomas require ENG 111. Students and their advisors will determine the correct second-level composition course to take: ENG 112, ENG 113, or ENG 114.

University transfer students are required to take ENG 111 and ENG 112 or ENG 113.

ENG 111, ENG 112, ENG 113, and ENG 114 are “freshman” level composition classes. These courses require the same intensity of study and dedication at the community college that is expected at East Carolina University or other four-year institutions. In order for these courses to transfer within our university transfer program, the requirements of our composition courses are the same as those of institutions in our university transfer articulation agreements.
